Installing HICAPS Connect

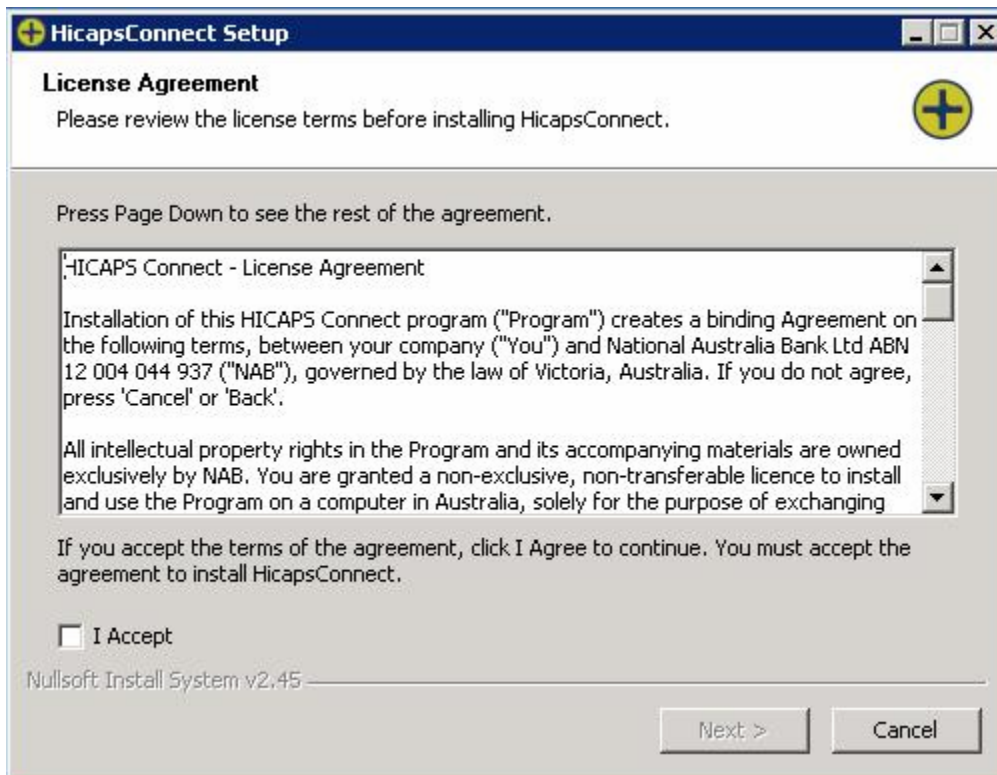
HICAPS Connect will need to be installed on each Windows terminal services session that requires access to the HICAPS terminal.

There is no need to load HICAPS Connect on to the Terminal Services Server its self.

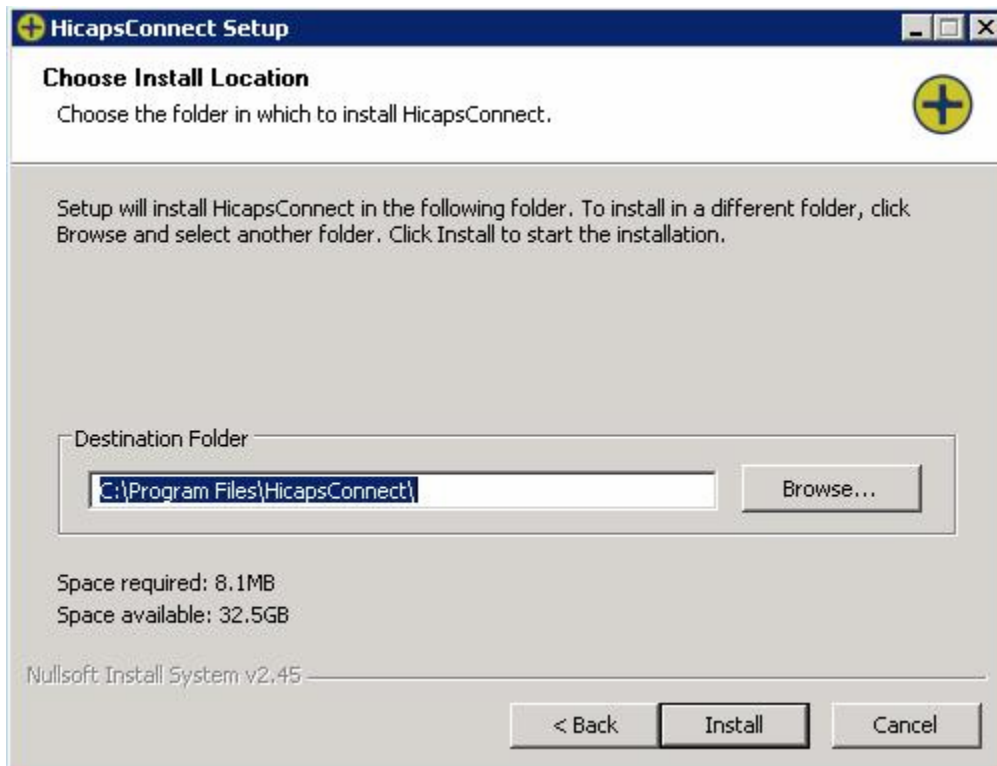
Note : Terminal services will not let you install an application from a LAN drive, so you may be required to copy the application onto the desktop then run the HICAPS Connect install.



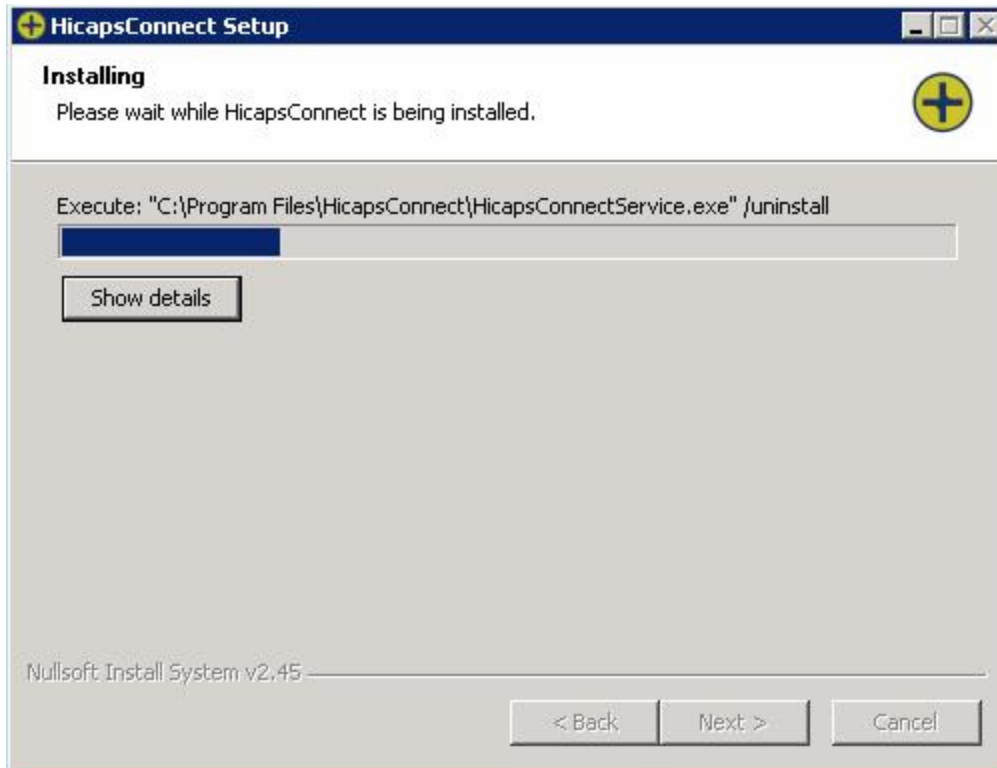
You will need to load the HICAPS Connect application under an administrator user



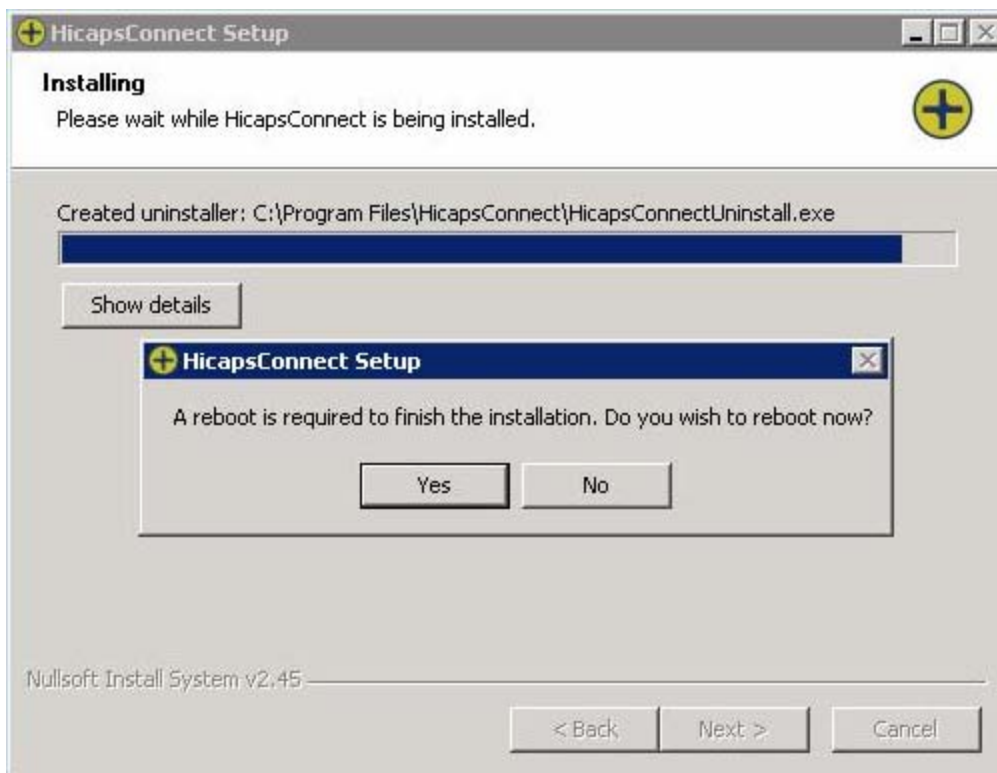
Please review the EULA and select the I Accept check box if you agree and select next



Select the directory where you would like the application installed and select Install



HICAPS Connect will install in your chosen directory



When HICAPS Connect has finished installing it will require a reboot.

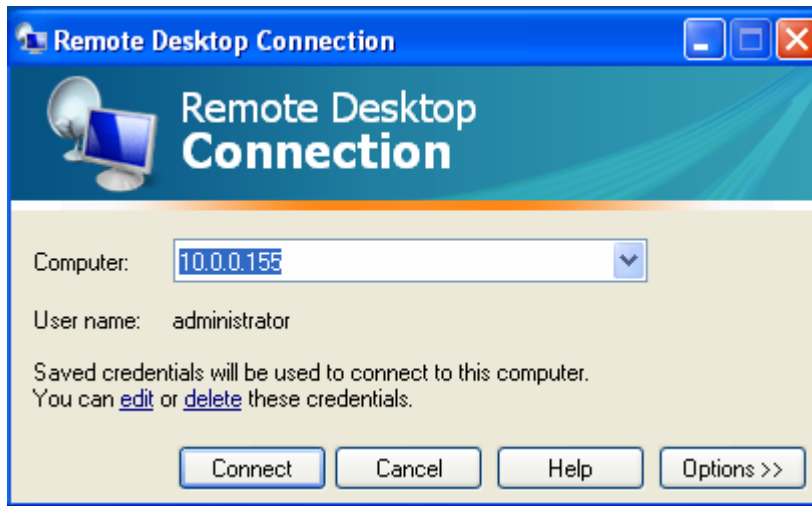
Note : This will reboot the Windows Terminal Services Server.

HICAPS Connect

Open Remote Desktop Connection

To open Remote Desktop Connection, click **Start**, point to **All Programs**, point to **Accessories**, point to **Communications**, and then click **Remote Desktop Connection**

Enter the Server name or TCP/IP address in the "Computer" list box.



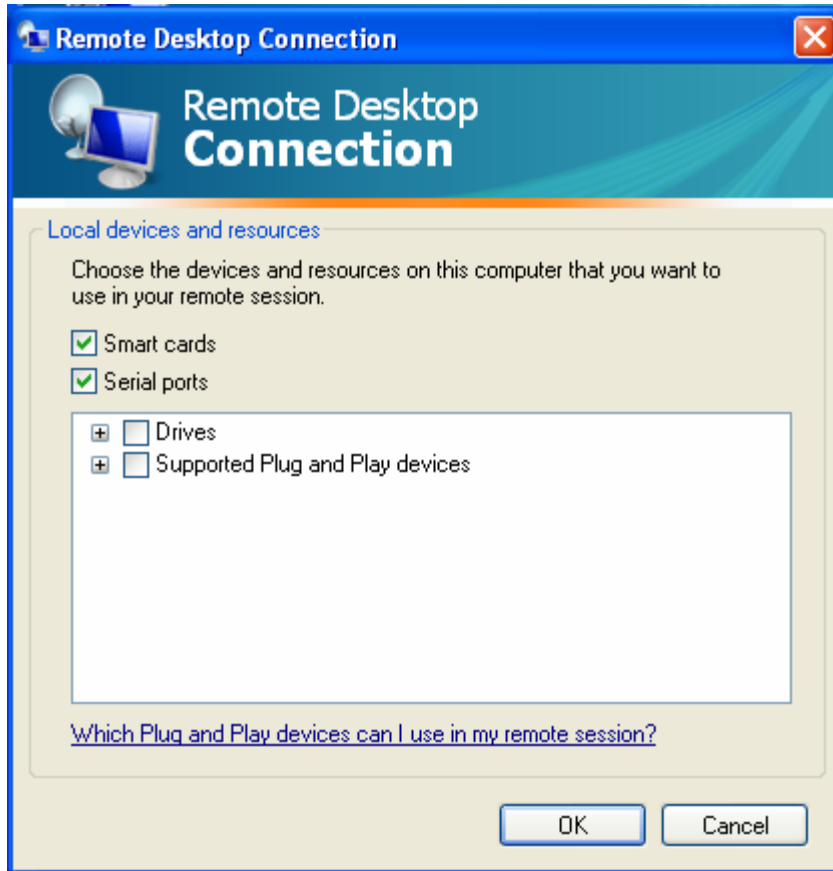
Select the "Local Resources" tab.



In the "Local devices and resources" area select the "More" button.



Select the “**serial ports**” check box and then click “**OK**”.

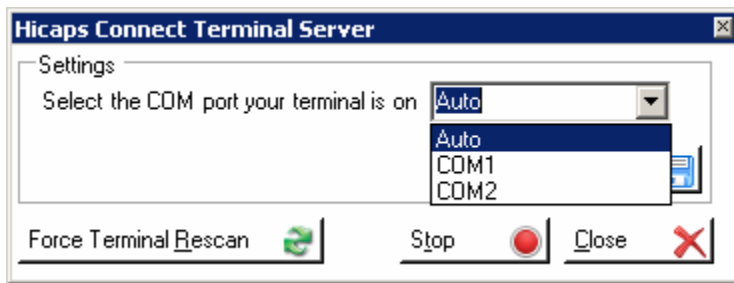


In the **Remote Desktop Connection** dialog box click **Connect**.

In the **Log On to Windows** dialog box, type your user name, password, and domain (if necessary), and then click **OK**.

This should start a Remote Desktop session window.

Then you can “**Start**” – “**All Programs**” – “**HicapsConnect**” – “**HicapsConnectServiceController**”.



Use a "Run" – "cmd" window on the server to issue a "change port /query" command to check the mapping of the local serial ports to the ports on the Terminal Server session. The "change port comx=comy" can be used to assign/reassign the port mappings.

portx=porty  Map port x to port y.
/D portx    Delete mapping for port x.
/QUERY      Display current mapping ports.

If you are running a firewall on your server you may need to open ports through the firewall to allow the 2 programs (your PMS Software and HICAPS Connect) to talk to each other. As there are many different types of firewalls and brands we cannot explain the process for opening ports for all of them. We recommend that you consult your user guide or help file about the firewall on your particular system.
